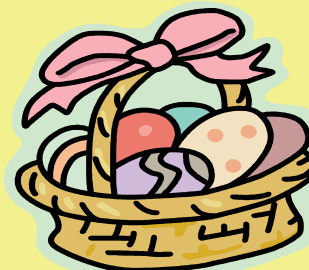

Demonstration

Giving a demonstration is an excellent way to teach others the skills you have learned in your 4-H club work. You can demonstrate on any subject you are interested in such as Ag., Home Ec., Food, Horse, or Other. Contestants may work individually or as a team of two. Demonstrations should not exceed 15 minutes.

Fashion Consumer Strategies

Select and model an outfit for a set of judges, sharing decisions made in the selection of the outfit. You also demonstrate decision making skills in selecting the most suitable of three outfits.

Senior Sewing & Fashion Contest

Contestants will be judged on construction, personal presentation, and interview responses. The contestant may choose to display or model the article they have sewn.

Senior Talent Contest

Individual or a team of two, three or four members. Youth share a talent performance in the discipline of their choice such a vocal, drama, dance, gymnastics, instrumental, comedy, etc. A maximum of five minutes is allowed for the talent performance. No minimum time.

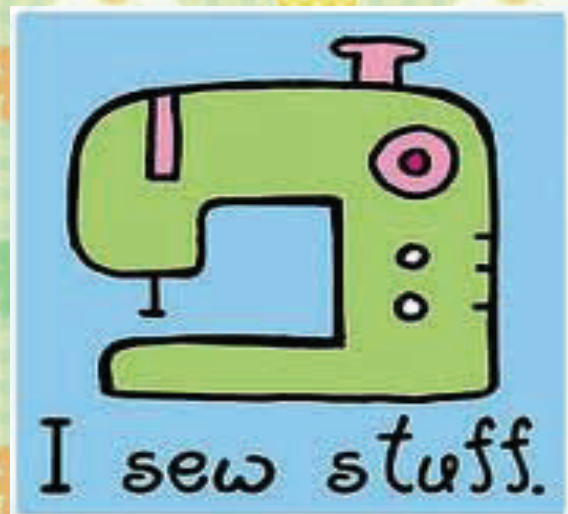

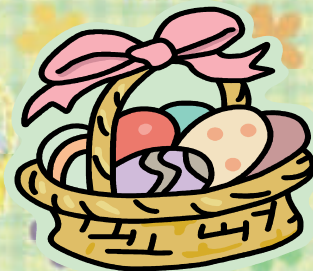

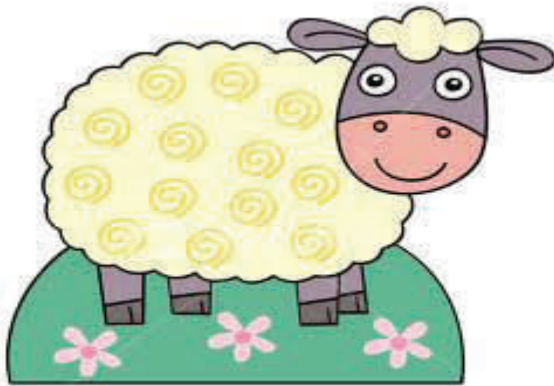

General Information:

Final placings are based on a combination of the evaluation of interview, modeling/display, and construction. The three highest in overall placing will receive awards. Contestants winning first place may not compete again. Contestants will only receive one award/year.

Categories:

Sewing – Display of project (i.e., quilt, baby dress, hand bag, etc).

Fashion – Modeling the project (i.e., gown, dress, or jacket).

Judging –

50% – 1) Construction

50% – 2) Modeling/Display with commentary and interview

Interview:

- Be prepared to discuss your project in detail and answer questions from the judges.
- Any additional information is welcomed to give the judges a good idea of your experiences with the project.
- At the conclusion of your interview, you will be asked to leave the project items with the judges so they are able to review them for construction details. A restroom with changing area is located close to the interview area.
- Project items will be kept safe until the 5:15pm rehearsal.

Display:

- A 6 foot table will be provided for the display. All or just a portion can be used to display the project.
- Contestant should briefly introduce themselves before interview
- Contestants will stand next to their item for the interview portion.

Modeling:

- Time limit of 1 ½ minutes
- Contestant should briefly introduce themselves before modeling
- Music will be provided
- Contestant's introduction will take care of any narrations

Introductions – Contestants can choose what he/she would like to tell the judges, but the following must be covered:

- Why did you choose this article?
- How do you plan to use it?
- If the pattern was changed, how?

For state competition, a copy of the completed Contestant Info Sheet needs to be in the State 4-H office by July 1. Fax (435-797-3268) or email this to lauralee.lyons@usu.edu. It is no longer necessary to bring patterns or instruction sheets to the contest. You may bring them if you feel it would be helpful during your interview, but they are not required.

The Fashion/Display/Talent Show and Banquet will be Tuesday evening. Contestants will meet at 5:15pm for a full dress rehearsal on stage.
